## About the San Francisco Department of Public Health

The mission of the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFPDH) is to protect and promote the health of all San Franciscans. SFPDH has 2 primary roles with two major divisions to fulfill its mission.

### San Francisco Health Network (SFHN)

SFHN comprises the direct health services that SFPDH provides to thousands of insured and uninsured San Franciscans. SFHN is the city's only complete care system and includes:

- Zuckerberg San Francisco Hospital and Trauma Center
- Laguna Honda Hospital and Rehabilitation Center
- Behavioral Health Services: Mental Health & Substance Abuse
- 14 Primary Care Clinics

### Population Health Division (PHD)

PHD addresses public health concerns, including customer safety, health promotion and prevention. PHD implements public health interventions, inspects restaurants, completes data analyses and research, and more.

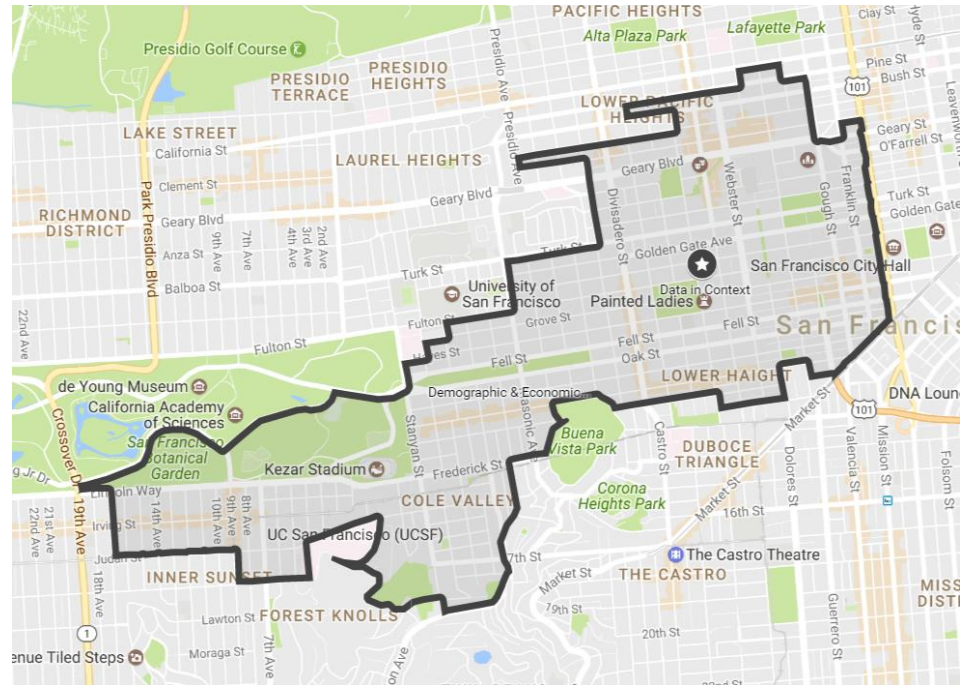

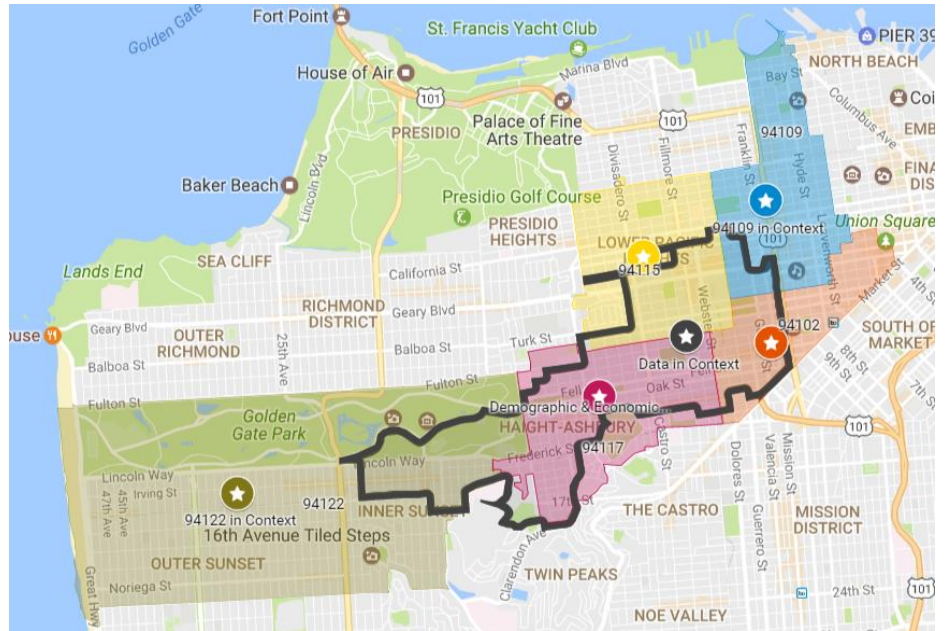
## Higher ER & Hospitalization Rates in 94102 for all listed causes

than SF overall. Hospitalization rate for COPD are the highest in SF, and 2<sup>nd</sup> highest for hypertension. ER rates for alcohol, depression, assault, and pneumonia are the highest in SF.

50% fewer live births to women with gestational diabetes in 94117 than in SF overall, and the lowest rate overall

50% more ER visits for alcohol abuse in 94109 than SF overall

3.3 years shorter life expectancy in 94102 than SF average, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> shortest overall

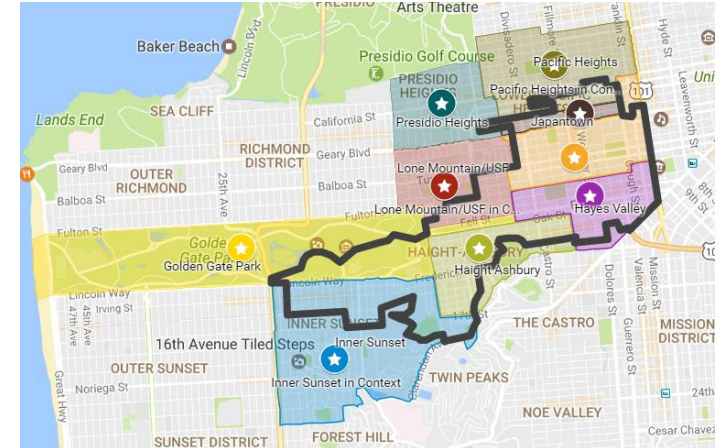

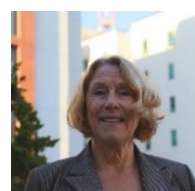

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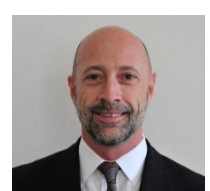

### Laguna Honda Hospital and Rehabilitation Center

Located on a 62-acre campus in the heart of the city, Laguna Honda is one of the largest skilled nursing facilities in the United States, and represents the one of the most extensive commitments by any city or county to therapeutic care for seniors and adults with disabilities.
